Early Roots of Giving

Her visits to rural India were an eye-opener she witnessed firsthand the deep interlinkages between economic prosperity, social wellbeing, and environmental sustainability.

The realization that social issues and environmental challenges are inherently connected fueled her resolve to dedicate capital and expertise toward fundamental change.

A Journey of Intentional Giving

For Leena, philanthropy is more than financial contributions; it is a long-term commitment to driving change through evidence-based interventions. The establishment of Raintree Foundation in 2018 marked the formal beginning of her philanthropic vision—a structured approach addressing climate resilience, to sustainability, and biodiversity conservation.

This (Raintree) isn't just a passion project—it is a generational commitment. We are building something that we hope will outlast us and create real, lasting change.



Key Principles of Strategic Philanthropy

- Do No Harm, Create Positive Impact: Raintree ensures that all investments and interventions uphold the dignity and well-being of both people and the planet going beyond minimizing harm to actively fostering regenerative and restorative solutions.
- Data-Driven and Deep Listening: Every initiative is anchored in rigorous data collection and meaningful engagement with communities. The organization prioritizes responding to real, lived realities rather than assumptions, ensuring that all efforts are rooted in ground-up insights.
- Interconnectedness and Circularity: Climate action is the foundation of Raintree's work, encompassing sustainability, circularity, and responsible consumption interlinked priorities. Circularity promotes a regenerative system where waste is minimized, resources are reused, and materials are kept in circulation for as long as possible.
- Civic Custodianship: Sustainable change requires community ownership. Raintree believes that the community is the true custodian of the environment and fosters civic custodianship-encouraging shared responsibility and empowering people to sustain and scale solutions for long-term well-being.

For the Dandekar family, philanthropy is more than just a shared responsibility—it is a shared philosophy, one built on a deep and evolving understanding of climate action. Their approach is structured around what they call 'nesting circles.'

- At the outermost level is climate action, which encompasses their broader vision.
 - Within it lies sustainability, a commitment to practices that ensure long-term ecological and social wellbeing.
 - Inside that, circularity serves as a guiding principle, reinforcing their belief that resources should be used regeneratively.

This structured philosophy has allowed the family to align their values, resources, and professional expertise in a way that is both strategic and deeply personal. Their commitment to climate action was largely influenced by the concerns of the younger generation.



A Generational Legacy

Leena co-founded Raintree Foundation with her children, Abha and Vivek Dandekar, who bring their unique expertise and passion to the organization. Abha leads the human resources function at Raintree and has given significant attention to mental health as a resilience measure.

Vivek, who serves on Raintree's board alongside his mother and sister, contributes to shaping the foundation's strategic vision and ensuring the seamless integration of philanthropy and impact investing. One of the defining aspects of their family philanthropy is their ability to integrate. They firmly believe that capital can and should be deployed strategically to create meaningful change. What sets the Dandekar family apart is their corporate thought process. Unlike many family-led philanthropic ventures where roles often blur, they have established clear professional boundaries while maintaining a shared purpose

Making an **Impact**

Water Security: 200 households with year-round access; 73 farm ponds and 30 solar pumps powering irrigation; 4.5M litres of safe drinking water delivered.

Livelihoods: Farmers' rice yields up 42.5%, 178 poultry units earning 145% profits, and 62 families accessing ₹13.5 lakh in no-interest livelihood loans.

Inclusion: 405 women raised 23 issues at Gram Sabhas, 1,500+ villagers sensitized in mental health, youth led gender equality campaigns across 11 villages.

Clean Energy: 8 villages with solar water systems serving 654 households, and 60 biodigesters saving ~75 trees a year while reducing women's drudgery.

Biodiversity: 571 plant and 172 bird specie

Biodiversity: 571 plant and 172 bird species documented, forest fires cut by 30%, 825 saplings planted, and 1,900+ people engaged in conservation. At the core of Raintree's mission is a landscape-based model that weaves together climate action, community empowerment, and biodiversity conservation. This integrated approach allows for holistic interventions that strengthen environmental resilience and human well-being simultaneously.

Raintree's work spans three key pillars:

- Climate: Promoting clean energy, agriculture, watershed ecology and conservation solutions to reduce environmental impact and enhance climate resilience.
- Community: Driving livelihood generation and fostering community resilience through regenerative agriculture, skill development, and inclusive grassroots initiatives.
- Biodiversity: Reviving watershed ecology and supporting biodiversity conservation through habitat restoration and protection of endemic species.

Raintree embeds gender equity, social inclusion, community custodianship, and grassroots mental health into all its work, ensuring interventions are locally led and sustainable. By promoting watershed management to mitigate floods and secure water, conserving biodiversity to boost carbon storage and climate adaptation, and advancing climate-resilient, agroecological farming to enhance food security and restore land, Raintree is poised to foster thriving ecosystems and resilient communities.

From Potter to Protector: How Raintree Foundation is Creating Environmental Champions in Velhe

In Sakhar village, Velhe, potter and shopkeeper Sandeep Kumbhar always cared for the environment but lacked direction—until Raintree Foundation arrived. Through their conservation programs, he found his calling.

Sandeep joined the Village Development Committee, Farmer Groups, and most notably, the Forest Fire Prevention Group, where he now leads efforts to protect local forests.

His journey from craftsman to environmental champion captures Raintree's impact: empowering villagers to become stewards of their land.



"In the past, battling with water shortage and scarcity was a huge problem. This farm pond has changed our lives. Now I can water the newly planted 100 mango trees in my farm, and have started a fishing business. This has certainly increased my income."

From Water Scarcity to Prosperity

Raintree Foundation's Farm Ponds transformed water-scarce farming in Velhe Taluka by storing rainwater for dry months. Farmers like Dnyanoba Phanse expanded cultivation, planted 100 mango trees, and started a profitable fishery, diversifying income.

This initiative enabled year-round highvalue crop production, boosted market opportunities, and enhanced climate resilience, ensuring long-term prosperity for agricultural communities.
