Early Roots of Giving




His approach is about creating systems that communities empower to thrive independently and become self-reliant.

His philanthropic framework is centered on:



Deep Dive into Menon's Initiatives

1. Women's Empowerment

- Young Mother Rehabilitation
 Program: Safe housing, employment at
 The Sobha Academy, free education for children, and remarriage support for widowed mothers
- Rural Women Empowerment
 Program: Financial and educational support for widowed mothers and their children.
- Employment for Women: Women prioritized for staff roles across all programs.
- No Dowry Social Wedding: Culturally sensitive weddings to ease family burdens and promote equality.

3. Healthcare and Well-being

- SOBHA Health Care: Free preventive and primary healthcare services, including dental, ophthalmology, physiotherapy, and home care.
- Community Medical Support: Annual health screenings, medicine distribution, and COVID-19 emergency relief.
- Mental Health & Substance Abuse Programs: Awareness and counselling initiatives.

5. Housing Initiatives

- SOBHA Community Home Project: Large-scale housing for women-led families.
- **Disaster Rehabilitation:** Homes rebuilt for flood and landslide-affected families.
- **Devi Home:** Safe housing for elderly women and orphaned girls.

2. Education for Girls

- The SOBHA Academy: Free CBSE education with holistic support including meals, transportation, healthcare, and hostel facilities.
- SOBHA ICON: Leadership and academic preparation in Science & Commerce streams for senior girls.
- University Scholarships: Financial aid for higher education at premier Indian universities.

4. ElderCare

- SOBHA Hermitage: Model senior citizen residence with medical and social support.
- Intergenerational Living: Students and seniors co-housed to foster empathy and connection.
- SOBHA Feed A Stomach Today Program: Provides meals to vulnerable seniors and students.

6. Green Initiatives

- **Sustainable Infrastructure:** Low land footprint, green construction, and ecofriendly practices.
- Water Conservation: Rainwater harvesting and community water reservoirs.
- **Renewable Energy:** Solar energy and plastic-free zones.
- Organic Farming: On-campus paddy and vegetable cultivation.
