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Letter From Our Core Founders

India's philanthropic moment is here, and it is growing.

In 2021, we came together with a conviction that India's wealth creators, given the right community and the right nudge, would choose to give generously, strategically, and early. Across professional networks, family businesses, startup ecosystems, and investment communities, we are witnessing a profound shift. Increasingly, wealth creators are asking not only how to build value but also how to create lasting impact.

Accelerate Indian Philanthropy (AIP) has grown into a trusted platform for this movement. Our network now spans **63 Founders** and close to **300 network members**. The growth of this community has been fuelled by a simple truth: philanthropy begets philanthropy. Every story shared and every commitment made creates confidence and conviction for others to act. The AIP network is proof of that.

At the same time, new tailwinds are reshaping the opportunity before us. India is creating wealth at an unprecedented pace. A new generation of founders, technology entrepreneurs, investors,

and wealth creators is emerging — many of whom are building at global scale and at remarkable speed. Their aspirations, motivations, and pathways into philanthropy may look different from those of previous generations. If India is to fully realise its philanthropic potential, we must reimagine what it takes to engage these leaders, helping them discover purpose, connect with pressing opportunities, and begin giving while they are still actively building. We hope more wealth creators choose to give earlier, more generously, and with deeper purpose, because the needs before us cannot wait. At the same time, we have come to see that philanthropy is a practice of continual learning rather than a destination of expertise. When people are able to reflect openly, challenge their own assumptions, and learn alongside peers, they build not only the confidence to begin, but the wisdom to keep giving well.

As AIP completes five years in 2026, our ambition is larger than building a network. We are helping build a culture where purposeful giving is seen as an integral part of leadership and success; where stories of generosity inspire others to act; and where private capital, guided by purpose and amplified by knowledge, contributes meaningfully to India's development.

We are grateful to every founder, member, and partner who carries this conviction forward. Together, we are writing a new and defining chapter in India's giving story.

Letter From Our Team

India is writing a new chapter where the creators of wealth are also becoming the architects of impact. That conviction is what AIP was founded five years ago and FY 2025–26 has been the year it deepened into something we can feel: a movement with real momentum and meaning.

The scale of the opportunity has never been greater. Today, **3,040 wealth creators** collectively hold over **₹104 lakh crore** in individual equity wealth, with each owning more than **₹425 crore***. Behind every one of those numbers is a wealth creator with the capacity to shape lives, build institutions, and drive change at scale. Unlocking a fraction of that potential for purposeful giving is what AIP exists to do.

The scale of India's philanthropic opportunity has never been greater. This unprecedented wealth creation presents a once-in-a-generation opportunity, not only to build businesses, but to build institutions, strengthen communities, and shape India's future. We believe that every wealth creator has the potential to become a nation builder through strategic philanthropy. Unlocking that potential is at the heart of our mission.

Two milestones in the year reflect the shift. We released **Live to Give**, a book written by the best-selling author, Rashmi Bansal. The book release, across four city-wide convenings, brought over 150 philanthropists and stakeholders together to make purposeful giving more visible, relatable, and aspirational. We also launched the **Accelerate India Pledge**, a tangible commitment device inviting wealth creators to dedicate at least 5% of their wealth over their lifetime to philanthropy.

With 32 UHNIs committing to the Pledge during the financial year, this is a powerful expression of intent. We also recognise that its true value lies in what follows: translating aspiration into action. Enabling wealth creators to move from commitment to practice will be among the most important priorities for AIP in the years ahead.

In FY 2025–26, 16 new founders joined AIP across Delhi, Mumbai, Bengaluru, Hyderabad, Dubai, and Singapore, bringing our Founders' community to 63 Founders. The diversity of this network, in geography, industry, generation, and giving stage, is its greatest strength. We partnered with over 60 network members to help build their giving journeys aligned with their motivations and interest areas. To help build perspective and disseminate learnings, we developed giving profiles of 22 network members, curated 11 sector primers and piloted our **SMEs Speak** series featuring domain experts.

We are grateful to our Core Founders, Founders and Network Members whose trust and commitment inspire everything we do. Their giving journeys continue to shape and strengthen this movement. We are equally grateful to every member of our team who shows up every day with rigour, warmth, and an unshakeable belief in AIP's vision - to see strategic philanthropy impact India's transformation.

We stepped into FY 2026–27 with renewed energy and determination. The foundation is strong. The movement is alive. The most important chapters are still to be written.

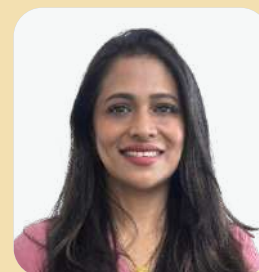

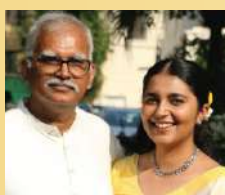

Accelerate India Pledge

Turning Intent into Commitment

The Accelerate India Pledge is AIP's flagship commitment mechanism—a public declaration to contribute at least **5%** of one's wealth, net worth, or shareholding to philanthropy over a lifetime.

By the close of **FY26**, **32 philanthropists and families** had signed the Pledge, representing leaders from technology, industry, healthcare, finance, and entrepreneurship across India and the diaspora.

NextGen Initiative

Inspiring the Next Generation of Givers

In July 2025, we launched the AIP NextGen Program, a nine-month journey for 10 young wealth creators and inheritors, guided by 8 mentors. While the program encapsulated a blend of mentorship, peer learning, field immersions, and volunteer work, the highlight was the cohort's enthusiastic engagement with a diverse set of nonprofits (Baala, Maitrayana, Lighthouse Communities, Y-Ultimate, Protsahan and Earth Warriors).



Bespoke Partnering

Every philanthropist's journey is unique.

Whether they are exploring a cause area for the first time, seeking to define their philanthropic purpose, or building a long-term giving portfolio, philanthropists often need trusted guidance and discovery of impactful opportunities.

In FY 2025-26, we partnered with 77 AIP network members, helping translate their intent into informed action through personalised engagement, curated knowledge, peer connections, practitioner interactions, and field exposure. Our role is not to prescribe solutions, but to help philanthropists discover the pathways that best align with their values, aspirations, and vision for impact.



Converting Philanthropic Intent to Action

AIP worked closely with the founders of a leading Indian manufacturing enterprise to help translate their philanthropic intent into a structured giving strategy. Through sector landscape research and facilitated discussions, AIP built the family's understanding of healthcare and environment, highlighting key challenges and effective intervention models. AIP also identified and conducted due diligence on a curated set of high-impact nonprofit organisations, assessing their governance, programmatic outcomes, and alignment with the family's priorities. Following structured interactions with these organisations, the family committed support to nonprofits working in maternal and child health, cancer care, and climate resilience.



Deepening Philanthropic Engagement in Sustainable Water Solutions

AIP partnered with a leading healthcare entrepreneur and philanthropist seeking to deepen her engagement with environmental sustainability, particularly in water conservation and rainwater harvesting. Through curated research, sector insights, and rigorous due diligence, AIP introduced her to high-impact nonprofit organisations aligned with her interests. These engagements enabled her to better understand the landscape, evaluate different approaches, and ultimately provide financial support to selected organisations. As part of the engagement, AIP also developed a giving profile capturing her motivations and approach.



Adopting a portfolio approach to philanthropy

AIP partnered with an industrialist from the manufacturing sector exploring giving opportunities across education, livelihoods, culture, sports, and faith-based initiatives. We connected him with a diverse set of nonprofits working in areas such as scholarships, teacher development, technology-enabled education, youth skilling, Indian language and cultural preservation, and spiritual learning. After evaluating different approaches, undertaking field visits, and engaging directly with the organisations' leadership teams, he decided to adopt a portfolio approach towards his philanthropy, to provide sustained support to a diverse set of organisations including an NPO based in the North-East focused on advancing sports at the grassroots level, and another NPO running a tech-enabled platform for higher education scholarships.

Building Salience

Philanthropy grows when it is seen, celebrated and aspired to.

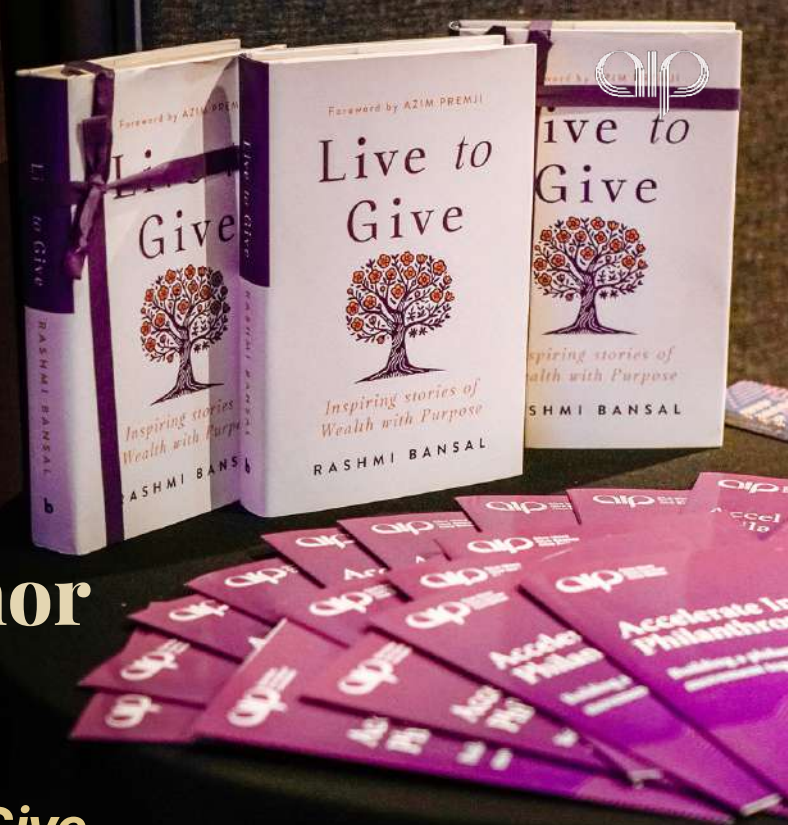
Towards this end, our endeavour is to make purposeful giving visible, through compelling narratives, resources and platforms that bring India's philanthropic stories to the mainstream. In 2025-26, we invested meaningfully in that work: launching a landmark book, convening philanthropists around shared ideas, and building a growing digital presence that carries the voice of India's giving movement far beyond our network.

AIP supported research for the book and curated its launch across four cities — **Delhi, Mumbai, Bengaluru, and Singapore**, bringing together over **150** philanthropists in intimate, inspiring conversations about what it means to give with purpose.

Hosted Convenings And Roundtable Discussions



Organised a convening in July 2025 in Mumbai, co-hosted by AIP Core Founders Amit Chandra (A.T.E. Chandra Foundation) and Vishal Tulsyan (MO Alternate Investment). The evening featured inspiring conversations and reflection-sharing from both first and next generation philanthropists.

Partnered with Centre for Social Impact and Philanthropy (CSIP) at Ashoka University in July 2025 for a virtual session on leveraging technology and AI in philanthropy.





Organised a convening in August 2025 in Hyderabad, co-hosted by AIP Founder Swathi Kantamani (NATCO Pharma) and Vinoda Kailas (Pravaha), featuring a fireside-chat with AIP Founder Mekin Maheshwari (Udhyam Learning Foundation) and Swati Vasudevan (Khan Academy) on nurturing entrepreneurial spirit and supporting long-term systemic impact.



Partnered with ACT Grants and Offline in November 2025 for a convening themed "Tech for Social Good" hosted by AIP Founder Aakash Chaudhary (Sparkl Edventure) in Delhi.





In July 2025, we launched the AIP NextGen Program — a nine-month journey for young changemakers, guided by 8 mentors. The cohort engaged with nonprofits such as Maitrayana, Lighthouse, Y-Ultimate and Earth Warriors, through flexible participation and volunteering opportunities. AIP Founder Tara Singh Vachani (Max India) and mentor for the program, hosted the cohort and mentors in December 2025, for a fireside chat with AIP Founder Dr. Ritesh Malik (Innov8) and interactive exchange of ideas.



Organised a panel discussion on “Enabling Purposeful Philanthropy for Impact” at the Digital Inclusion Summit 2026, featuring AIP Founders Anupama Dalmia (Seekho Sikhao Foundation) and Jaishree Goyal (Anandaya Foundation) with Shaifalika Panda (Bansidhar & Ila Panda Foundation), moderated by Radhika Jain (AIP’s Philanthropy Partner & COO).



Co-hosted an intimate convening in Bengaluru in February 2026 with Tanya and Vishal Bali (Neonates Foundation of India), featuring Peggy Dulany (Fourth-Gen Member of the Rockefeller Family) in conversation with AIP Founder Ajit Isaac (Quess Corporation). The dialogue explored forging an independent philanthropic identity, building trust-based collaborations, and leading with purpose.

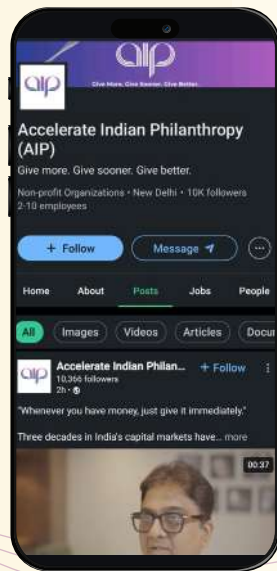
Launched Turning Points With TCF And SCALE

In partnership with The Convergence Foundation (TCF) and SCALE, AIP co-launched Turning Points: How Philanthropists Sparked Systemic Change — a book that profiles eleven philanthropists and traces how their giving, combined with government partnerships, has driven population-level impact. Convenings in Delhi and Mumbai brought together philanthropists and ecosystem leaders for candid conversations on the potential of long-term, systems-oriented giving. The initiative underscored the importance of cross-sector partnerships and shared learning in enabling philanthropy to achieve lasting change.

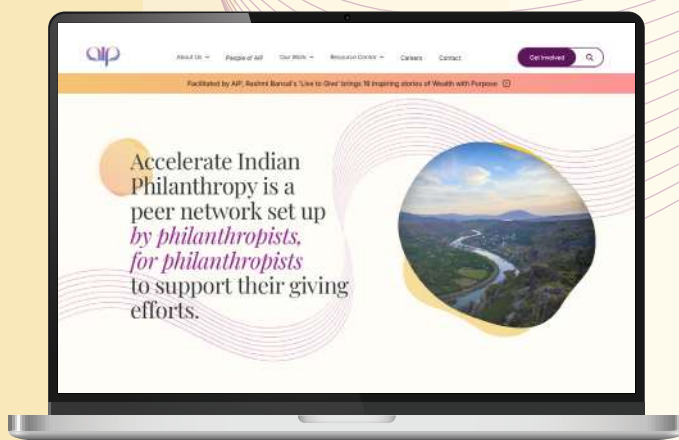
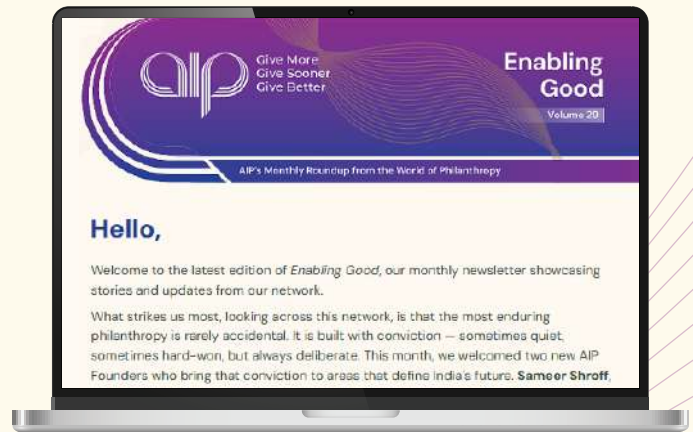

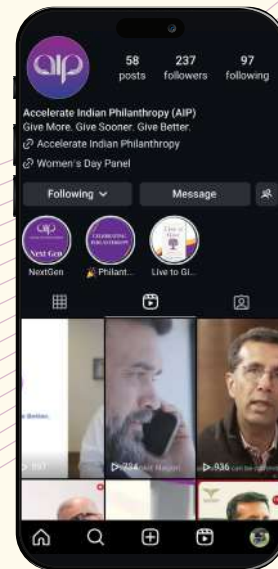
Our LinkedIn community reached **10,000** followers, with our strongest impressions driven by the **Live to Give** campaign.

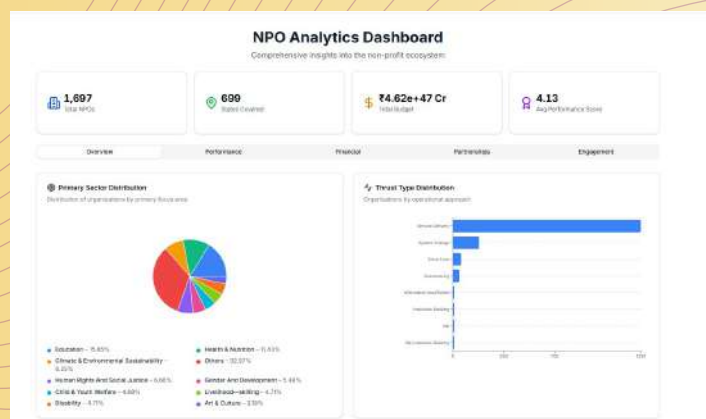
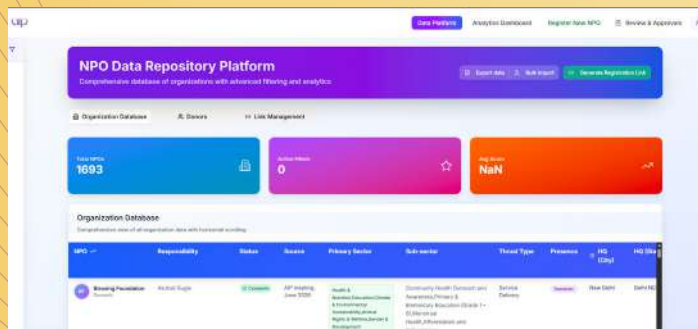

Since its inception, AIP has been building a repository of credible nonprofit organisations to support more informed giving. In FY 2025–26, this repository was digitised and launched as an online platform. Today, the repository features over 1,700 nonprofit organisations across diverse sectors and geographies, with over 500 organisations added during the year. Each organisation is supported by structured information and AIP's due diligence framework, enabling philanthropists to navigate the social sector with greater confidence and make informed giving decisions.

Looking Ahead FY 2026 - 27

AIP enters FY 2026-27 as a strategic evolution from building an organisation to expanding a movement. For AIP, completing five years is a chance to look back at how far the idea has travelled and forward at how much further it can go. FY 2026-27 is the year we build the movement with greater intentionality.

Everything we do will sit across three interlocking pillars: Network Building, Bespoke Partnering, and Building Salience. Each one is held up by a foundation of meaningful knowledge resources that will equip our network members with both the confidence and the clarity to give well. The work in each will deepen with one outcome: more wealth creators giving more, sooner, and better.

We will grow the network not just in size but in commitment, bringing more wealth creators into genuine, sustained giving journeys while investing more meaningfully in those already on the path.

Champions from within our network will play a more active role as mentors and peers to emerging givers because the most powerful thing we can offer a first-time giver is the story of someone they respect and who started exactly where they are. At the heart of this effort sits the **Accelerate India Pledge**: a personal, meaningful commitment to make giving a defining part of one's identity, woven into the fabric of how one chooses to live and lead.

In our salience work, we will shift from visibility to narrative leadership, from being present in India's philanthropy discourse to shaping it. This virtuous arc between starting to give, impact, and giving more is the most compelling story in India's development journey and it is one that deserves to be told with depth and reach. We will celebrate India's rich and ancient culture of generosity and position strategic philanthropy as its most powerful modern expression. Through

thought leadership, media partnerships, and a growing digital presence, we will work to shape the discourse around giving in India.

This year, we are launching The AIP Circle, bringing together our founders, pledgers, and network members to celebrate how far this movement has come and sets the tone for the decade ahead. It is the kind of gathering that only becomes possible after years of trust-building. Our hope is that the conversations and reflections will inspire the next generation of givers.

Philanthropy can make a difference. Philanthropists want to make a difference. And philanthropists are best at inspiring each other. Everything we do in the year ahead is in service of that simple, powerful truth.
